Embarked on several reform projects involving organizational and structural foundations such as strengthening decentralization, balancing and attractiveness of territories, modernization of public services, improvement of the quality of services provided to citizens, redefinition of the economic role of local authorities ... etc., the Ministry of Interior, Local Authorities and Territorial Planning faces significant challenges that place it at the forefront of the challenges of governance.

In this context, and aware of the challenge of the necessary availability of a qualified human resource for the design, implementation and monitoring of the many projects it has embarked on, the Ministry of Interior, Local Authorities and Territorial Planning has put in place a strategy to train its human resources in order to increase their performance and enable them to be equal to the missions and challenges.

In this process, the network of training institutions at the Ministry's disposal has been strengthened by the launch of two additional training centers for the staff of local authorities, the dematerialization of the training process, the establishment of a National school of city engineers and a network to train trainers to ensure that actions of training meet standards and norms.

Accordingly, the role of international cooperation in training and expertise in the various fields of relevance to the strategy of the Ministry of Interior has been strengthened through the expansion of foreign partners.

It is in this context that in 2015, a memorandum of understanding was signed between The Ministry of interior and the China National Academy of Governance (CNAG) which led to training and capacity-building activities held for more than 400 Algerian officials and senior officials.

In compliance with these actions and in order to strengthen governance capacities, an international forum will be organized on 04 and 05 December 2018, at the International Conference Center in Algiers.

This international Forum will be attended by several national and international experts, and will provide an opportunity to share different experiences in governance capacity-building around the world. The objective is to enable our education and training schools and institutions

to strengthen their capacity to produce a highly-skilled human resource and scientific research in the service of governance.

The goal is to come up with an integrated training strategy converging towards the achievement of governance objectives.

GLOBAL TRENDS ON GLOBAL CAPACITY BUILDING

It is recognized that the senior officers play a major role in the conception and the implementation of development policies and programs in each country. The reinforcement of capacities will certainly empower them to define and attain objectives, solve problems and ultimately carry out their missions effectively.

The key issue is to identify how to reinforce the capacities of this category and to develop adapted programs for training and upgrading.

In this context, we have been witnessing for some years the implementation of competition among elites national training institutions, who no longer hesitate to make colossal investments and often opt for outsourcing of training activities. In addition, more certification and accreditation processes are being used to ensure the quality of training.

Purpose of the panel

This panel is led to reflect on the steps to be taken to put in place an effective policy in terms of capacity building for public decision-makers in Algeria through exchange of successful experiences from around the world and especially our partners, china, France, Canada, the Netherlands...

Key topics of the panel

- Content of initial and continuous training programs for elites;
- Methods to identify and prioritize the types of capacities to be reinforced, based on the characteristics of each environment;
- Organization, implementation and evaluation of capacity-building policies of decision-makers either at the internal level of public institutions or at the level of training institutions.

PANEL N°2:

GIVE FULL PLAY TO THE DUAL FUNCTIONS OF SCIENTIFIC RESEARCH AND DECISION-MAKING CONSULTATION IN SCHOOLS OF GOVERNANCE TO ENHANCE PUBLIC SERVICE CAPACITY

All the schools of "governance" around the world, regardless of the name or the status given to them, converge towards a single objective, the training of executives called upon to take positions of responsibility having a direct impact on the management of public services.

Nevertheless, other functions such as scientific research and decision-making consultation, which are of equal importance, must be highlighted since they allow these institutions to be influential at the national, regional and international levels through their contribution to capacity-building in the public service management.

Indeed, and beyond their role of provider to the user sectors, of a human resource characterized by its degree of employability and adaptability commensurate with the requirements necessary to improve the quality of public services, it is up to these schools (schools, institutes, universities ... etc) to lead the scientific research in the areas of governance (public administration, public management, public policies ... etc) and to be a partner-actor in decision-making and providing technical support in order to make informed decisions.

Purpose of the panel:

This panel aims to identify the modalities (or ways and means) that allow schools of "governance" to strengthen their role of expertise through the development of research.

- Identification of exogenous and endogenous factors that hinder the development of research and expertise activities within schools of "governance";
- What types of research expertise can these schools develop (or how to integrate the school into its environment?),

PANEL N°3:
Call for closer international cooperation in governance capacity enhancement, to build a community of shared future for mankind

This panel will examine the long-term issues of governance capacity-building in the context of international cooperation that will contribute to building a community with a shared future for mankind. The discussion will focus on strengthening cooperation based on common strategies and agendas of countries and international organizations.

Purpose of the panel:

The panel will develop both an expanded view in terms of international standards on governance capacity building, recommendations on improving the international supply for capacity building, and a plan to mobilize international cooperation in the field of governance.
